2024 SUMMER COURSE - HOUSING INFORMATION

TRAVEL REQUIREMENTS and ARRIVAL DETAILS

Checking In and Moving out of the Summer Residence

The official move-in date for the PNB Summer Residence is **Sunday, July 7th** from 11:00am to 6:00pm.

The official move-out date for the Summer Residence is **Saturday, August 10th** by noon.

Airport Shuttles

Optional PNB School airport shuttle service to and from Seattle-Tacoma International Airport (with PNB School staff members to meet students at baggage claim) will run from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. on move-in day and from 4 a.m. to 11 a.m. on move-out day. From July 9th to August 8th, special arrangements may be made to have residence staff members pick up and drop off students at the airport, including assistance with check-in and baggage. Shuttle registration forms will be sent later. On move-in and move-out days, July 7th and August 10th, PNB staff can provide assistance and transportation only during the stated hours. Please schedule your flights accordingly.

COST

Room and Board:	\$4,253 Shared Room (includes \$500 non-refundable housing deposit)
	\$4,903 Single Room (includes \$500 non-refundable housing deposit)

All rooms are available on a first-come, first-served basis for the five-week period; this includes a non-refundable \$500.00 deposit due by January 31st, 5pm, Pacific Standard Time. The remaining balance of \$3,753.00 (shared) or \$4,403.00 (single) is due April 1. No refunds will be given for any reason after May 1st.

REGISTRATION AND PAYMENT INFORMATION

Students who wish to reserve a space in the Summer Residence must choose this option when registering for classes (please follow the registration link included with your acceptance email). Demand may exceed space available; therefore, reservations will be made on a first come, first served basis. In order to reserve a place at the residence, a non-refundable advance deposit of \$500.00 is required. The deposit deadline is January 31, 2024, 5pm, Pacific Standard Time. The remaining housing fee balance is due by April 1, 2024. No housing refunds will be given for any reason after May 1, 2024 (and the \$500.00 housing deposit is absolutely non-refundable). We will contact you if housing has already reached capacity when we receive your payment. We encourage you to call the PNB School office at 206.441.2435 with any questions regarding registration.

ABOUT THE SUMMER RESIDENCE

Location

Pacific Northwest Ballet School's Summer Residence is in a comfortable dormitory on the Seattle Pacific University campus, located one and one-half miles from the Phelps Center. Seattle Pacific is a small and beautiful campus in a quiet residential district with direct bus access to Seattle Center, where the Phelps Center is located. Bus service is readily available from Seattle Center to downtown, University of Washington, Capitol Hill, and other parts of the city.

Residence features include:

- Secure building (requires a keycard for entry)
- Uniformed 24-hour campus security, on alert at all times to maintain campus safety
- Experienced PNB residence staff members on duty at all times
- Wireless internet access

- Locking rooms with Wi-Fi in each room
- Twin beds – students must provide mattress pads (if desired), sheets (extra-long twin size), pillows, blankets, towels, and all personal supplies, including soap, shampoo and laundry detergent
- Laundry facilities (washer/dryer fees are included in your housing payment)
- Optional student activities will be added if Covid-19 restrictions allow
- Ice machine in the Residence, accessible 24 hours daily
- Common areas cleaned by SPU custodial staff

Residence Dining information:

- Varied and healthful meals are offered daily at the SPU dining hall for breakfast, lunch, and dinner (sack lunches are provided by food services staff Monday through Saturday for PNB students). Providing healthy options is something SPU's dining team proudly does every day. They offer nutritious and satisfying meals, highlighting well-balanced menu choices
- Hot meals will be served by food services staff
- Gluten-free and vegetarian options provided at all meals (vegan only with pre-registration)
- Snacks and other necessities such as cold drinks, bottled water, laundry detergent, and feminine hygiene products are available for purchase from the PNB Summer Residence "Dorm Store" outside cafeteria hours

Supervision

The Residence is staffed 24 hours per day by experienced, adult residence counselors and the PNB Summer Residence Director, all living in the residence throughout the program. All residence counselors are certified in CPR/First Aid. Students must check in and out at all times and curfews are strictly enforced. Rules and guidelines for students living in the Summer Residence, COVID protocol, additional testing requirements, and any further updates will be sent to Summer Course students at a later date.

Daily Transportation to Class

PNB School provides daily round-trip transportation for Summer Residence students Monday through Saturday timed to coincide with the PNB School class schedule. Off-duty residence staff will provide occasional transportation for medical reasons; however, we cannot provide regular transportation for therapy or other recurring appointments.

Student Activities

The residence staff will plan a range of nightly and weekend activities for students living in the Summer Residence. A complete description of optional weekend and evening activities, some of which may require pre-registration and pre-payment, will be included in the information sent to registered Summer Residence students in May. These may include professional sports events, tours, performances, and local sites of interest.

Registered students will receive additional information and paperwork later this spring, including more details on housing, student rules and regulations, roommate requests, airport transportation, and local lodgings for family members, as well as student contact information during the Summer Course and directions for completing all required forms and agreements.
