# ARTISTIC DIRECTOR



As we launch our fifty-first season at Pacific Northwest Ballet with all the customary fanfare, *Petite Mort* offers a much-needed dose of levity and laughter. At this juncture, I am truly grateful for the supportive team I work with at PNB. Let us take this opportunity to look back on the season past—and oh, what a season it was.

The first word that comes to mind is ambitious. In addition to the return of audience favorites like *The Nutcracker, Swan Lake, Giselle, Carmina Burana, A Midsummer Night's Dream* and *Snow White*, we also offered six world premieres and one company premiere. New works are what keep PNB alive, current, and on the cutting edge. They draw national attention; attract dancers, audiences, and critics; and offer career-defining opportunities to choreographers, designers, and artists. They also serve as an economic engine spurring ticket buyers, individual donors, corporations, and foundations to support experimentation and innovation. As with everything we do at PNB, approaching new works with an awareness of equity and inclusion advances the core principles of our institution.

Let's recall the seven new works PNB presented this past season: Catching Feelings choreographed by Dwight Rhoden captured a new generation of wildly talented young dancers at PNB. Dwight found a post-pandemic exuberance in the company that epitomized a new era at the dawn of our fiftieth anniversary season.

Alexei Ratmansky's *Wartime Elegy* used dance to process the war in Ukraine in a poignant work that centered the joy and humanity of Ukrainian people, coupled with the pathos of senseless loss. This was a supreme example of the ability of our art form to comment on our world and its people.

Alejandro Cerrudo created *Black on Black on Black* as an exploration of movement in bodies and in space. Dancers became liquid embodiments of energy and flow as they moved to a now familiar Cerrudo playlist of contemporary composers. PNB is proud to offer a canon of works by Alejandro Cerrudo.

Jessica Lang brought Pergolesi's *Stabat Mater* to life in *Let Me Mingle Tears With Thee*, a series of sculptural portraits and interdependent dances that created community before our eyes. Jessica understands the power of image and gesture. Her connection in the studio to dancers, musicians, and artistic staff is palpable and deserves further exploration.

Crystal Pite's *The Seasons' Canon* offered a transformative experience of fifty-four dancers including almost the entire company and eighteen professional division students. Crystal's presence created a heightened experience to all involved. The work was monumental, bringing hundreds to PNB for the first time. Mixed repertory works are not customarily entry points of newcomers, but Crystal Pite changed all that with *The Seasons' Canon*. I can't wait to see it again in April.

Who creates a winning work about dung beetles? That's right, Annabelle Lopez Ochoa. Her work *Khepri* was fresh, physical, unexpected, and at times euphoric. The dancers captured a new energy and experimentation in this unique work.

To close out our season, Kiyon Ross delivered a burst of joy, movement, musicality, and a pure celebration of all things PNB in ...throes of increasing wonder. Every member of the company entered the studio each day to discover the transformative power of dance as only Kiyon can offer. The work was the perfect finale for a season of new works.

PNB pulled off an absolutely extraordinary fiftieth anniversary celebration. Community support through fundraising, ticket sales, partnerships, and praise were essential and appreciated. We are at a beautiful and well-deserved place in our history with excitement about what's to come. PNB has never looked better.





### **LETTER FROM THE**

# EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR



PNB's fiftieth anniversary season, which Peter aptly characterized as ambitious, was a year designed to honor and celebrate the people and programs that built and defined PNB, while meaningfully advancing recovery from pandemic losses. That meant creating moments throughout the season to celebrate our founding artistic directors, Kent Stowell & Francia Russell; inviting alumni from our company and school back for recognition during *A Midsummer Night's Dream*; and acknowledging often that we are here in the first place, and still here, because of our audience. Fifty years times many thousands of people choosing to invest in the singular thrill of PNB performances, affirm the importance of art and artists through contributed support, and advocate for our vibrant arts and culture community as an essential part of the engine driving our region's powerful creative economy.

We were also quite future-focused during our fiftieth anniversary, and clearly embraced ballet's continuing evolution by celebrating diverse choreographic voices alongside the established artistic pillars of our art form. About 30% of PNB's audience was new to us last season, affirming that a more inclusive, representative approach to our work is resonating in our greater community. Pair that with electrifying work onstage, and the result is earned revenue from ticket sales exceeding budget targets across many programs last season. This allowed us to retain and stretch into the future a greater percentage of the funds made possible through federal Covid relief programs – critical to our sustainability since 2021. Successful resolution of employment contracts with

three of our four labor unions this past season also helped mitigate variables in our budgeting work, which continues to be impacted by market volatility, escalating expense in every area of our work, and shifting audience trends across the arts and culture sector.

We took time during our fiftieth to understand and be responsive to our shifting civic landscape, our relationship with all of our stakeholders, and implement further action steps around our inclusion, diversity, equity and accessibility (I.D.E.A.) priorities. We continued to amplify that "A" in I.D.E.A .with refinement of our sensory friendly performances, a new Dance for All class for ballet students with disabilities, and community education programs across King County that repeatedly affirm for us that there is individual, family, and community benefit when we act on our guiding principle to inspire, engage, and educate through dance.

We also advanced work last season evaluating our facilities at Seattle Center and how best to prepare for PNB's future with spaces where artists, students, staff, and community members can thrive, especially in the face of rapid external development: impending Sound Transit construction in our neighborhood and the redevelopment of Memorial Stadium just outside our back door.

Clearly, these continue to be consequential times for PNB. In collaboration with other arts, culture, science, and heritage organizations, we continue to lobby for the sustainability of our sector in an evolving region with many competing priorities. We ask to be seen, appropriately, as both nice, and necessary. Arts and culture businesses make up 10.8% of our state's GDP. We represent more than 187,000 jobs, or 5.2% of our workforce. We know there is a 3-to-1 multiplier effect on spending in neighborhoods with the presence of performing arts organizations. And that's before we get to social impact and education outcomes and our indispensable role in fostering human connection, inspiration, and understanding. Let's not forget joy. That was in no short supply with our opening weekend performances of the first program of our fifty-first season. Thank you to those of you who joined us and for everyone who made it possible for us to raise the curtain on another stellar season: our amazing PNB team of deeply caring staff members and artists, a dedicated, supportive Board of Trustees and Advisory Council, and our again, our much-appreciated audience of fans and friends who step with us into PNB's next chapter.

Pacific Northwest Ballet recognizes the historical and present inequities in ballet and is committed to shifting the culture in our Company and art form through meaningful action and reflection. We strive to be an arts organization that reflects our community and is relevant, accessible, and welcoming to everyone.

Throughout PNB's history, we have understood the importance of how classical arts organizations show up in, and for, their communities. Since 2014, PNB has moved this commitment front and center, dedicating more time and resources to ensure a more inclusive, diverse, equitable, and accessible PNB and ballet field.

The Pacific Northwest Ballet (PNB) Inclusion, Diversity, Equity, & Accessibility (I.D.E.A.) Committee is a cross-functional committee that values equity, diversity, inclusion, and accessibility as guiding organizational principles. We seek to reflect and embrace our community and to provide a welcoming and inclusive environment in which artists, audiences, students, staff and volunteers of all backgrounds learn, collaborate, and participate for the benefit of all. The work of the I.D.E.A. Committee directly supports PNB's mission to inspire, engage, and educate through dance. Diversity and diverse perspectives advance PNB's ability to achieve new standards of excellence in every aspect of its organization. PNB seeks to build a fully-inclusive, anti-racist, multicultural organization, creating space for shifting perspectives that reflect our industry's continual evolution.

### The I.D.E.A. Committee is dedicated to:

- Building PNB artist, board, faculty, staff, student, and volunteer awareness about issues relating to race and other forms of diversity.
- Promoting learning opportunities for all artists, board, faculty, staff, and students around equity, race and other forms of diversity, and inclusion.
- Integrating equity learning and work throughout all facets of the organization.
- Filtering PNB's programs, practices, and policies through a lens that is sensitive to issues around equity, race and other forms of diversity, accessibility, and inclusion.
- Developing and implementing an annual I.D.E.A. Action Plan.
- Centering underrepresented perspectives across the organization through community collaboration and professional consultation.
- Cultivating authentic relationships and engagement with under-invited communities in our work outside of PNB.
- Inviting feedback relating to I.D.E.A. work from artists, board, faculty, staff, student and families, volunteers, audiences, and community partners.
- Ensuring our artistic output is reflective of our community.
- Maintaining public transparency by I.D.E.A. Committee updates and statements to our website and annual report.

# NEW I.D.E.A. INITIATIVES AT PNB IN 2022-2023

- PNB held its second sensory-accessible season, and received certification through the International Board of Sensory Accessibility for its sensory-accessible seasons and venue. PNB's sensory-processing resources, developed in partnership with Sensory Access, include eight sensory kits that may be checked out at any performance, seven sensory guides to assist patrons during a performance, two social narratives, and training for front of house staff.
- PNB offered two sensory-friendly performances, for *George Balanchine's The Nutcracker®* in December 2022 and *Snow White* in March 2023, with free and reduced-price tickets to nearly 2,000 attendees.
- PNB continued its partnership with Seattle Theatre Group to provide free STG Dance for PD® (Parkinson's disease) classes for participants and care givers at the Francia Russell Center.
- After a soft launch in spring 2022, PNB rolled out Pay What You Can nights for each repertory program, with tickets as low as \$5 for Thursday performances, selling nearly 800 Pay What You Can tickets over the course of the season.
- The PNB Costume Shop created 63 new unitards for *Carmina Burana*, custom created to match each dancer's skin tone. Each unitard was dyed by Wyly Astley, painted by Shelby Rogers, and color matched and fit by Pauline Smith.
- PNB completed its *Race: The Power of An Illusion* training series, having trained over 300 staff, Professional Division students, and Board members.
- PNB commissioned Theresa Ruth Howard to create a Cultural Competency and Equity-based training module focused on ballet and PNB.
- In observance of International Holocaust Remembrance Day, PNB hosted a Community Open House in partnership with Holocaust Center for Humanity, the Jewish Federation of Greater Seattle, Mary Schwartz Summit, the Stroum Jewish Community Center, Temple Beth Am, and Temple De Hirsch Sinai. This free event featured a panel discussion moderated by PNB faculty member Miriam Landis, with the intention to bring history to life in a way that celebrates hope, inclusion, and resilience. Our sincere gratitude to Miriam and the participating panelists, Rabbi Samuel Klein, Pamela Lavitt, Beverley Silver, Dee Simon, Eva Stone, and Rabbi Daniel A. Weiner for sharing their time and experiences.
- The I.D.E.A. Committee launched its Welcome Buddy program, designed to welcome new hires and acquaint them with both PNB's culture and the Seattle and Bellevue areas/services.



# PNB SCHOOL

Founded in 1974, Pacific Northwest Ballet School is recognized as one of the top three ballet training institutions in the United States. Under the direction of Peter Boal, the School provides a complete, professional curriculum to hundreds of students at The Phelps Center and The Francia Russell Center (over 1,100 students pre-Covid). In 2022—2023, PNB School's attendance increased to 800 students.

317

PNB's Summer Course drew 317 students at PNB School's two campuses. At the Phelps Center, 210 students ages 12—18 (from 36 states, Canada, and Japan) enrolled in this 5-week intensive program. The Francia Russell Center welcomed 107 students ages 8—14, both from PNB School and other local students accepted to the program via audition. PNB School's Eastside Summer Dance Workshops drew an additional 267 students ages 5—7.

In September 2021, PNB welcomed 36 Professional Division students—20 new students and 16 returning. The 2022—2023 Professional Division class represented 14 states, Washington, D.C., and the Canadian province New Brunswick.

PNB School awards scholarships purely based on need and is able to award partial or full tuition scholarships to most students who apply. PNB School awarded a total of \$490,827 in tuition assistance in 2022-2023 to 156 students at its Seattle and Bellevue locations, including the academic year, Summer Course, and DanceChance.

After a five-year hiatus, 49 dance educators from across the country gathered in April for PNB School's 28th Teachers' Seminar. Participants attended 25 events over the four-day seminar, including 5 demonstrations of the PNB syllabus; lectures on nutrition, mental health, and pointe work for young dancers; two panel discussions focused on PNB's work in Inclusion, Diversity, Equity, and Accessibility; opportunities to observe School and Company classes; and tickets to dress rehearsal and performances of *A Midsummer Night's Dream*. As always, participants left the seminar renewed and inspired to share new ideas with their own students.

# I.D.E.A. INITIATIVES AT PNB SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY EDUCATION

### PNB STRIVES TO PROVIDE CONSISTENT, MEANINGFUL SUPPORT OF ALL DANCERS IN PNB SCHOOL & COMMUNITY EDUCATION PROGRAMS, INCLUDING:

- Live captioning for Family Matinee performances.
- Updated dress code to allow flesh-colored tights and shoes in all levels.
- Adaptive dance classes via STG Dance for PD® and Seattle Public School partnerships.
- Expanded summer course audition locations in order to reach a more diverse student population.
- New Voices and New Voices II for Levels VII and VIII, choreography classes for young women.
- Mentorship programs for all advanced students and DanceChance students.
- Serving as LGBTQ+ safe space.
- Opportunities for gender and non-gender conforming students to dance and train on pointe.
- Removal of gender references in class and in printed materials including casting; inclusion of pronouns for students on all registration forms.
- Additional gender inclusivity including a gender neutral rest room and pronoun pins provided for all staff and students.
- Racial equity training for all School faculty, staff, and accompanists, and diversity training/discussion specific to PNB School faculty members.
- Implementation of anti-harassment and anti-racist statement for all students.
- Progress toward greater diversification of faculty with new hires and guest teachers.
- Organization-wide trainings around the docu-series *Race: The Power of an Illusion* concluded in spring 2023, having trained over 300 staff, Professional Division students, and Board members.
- Ongoing membership in the Cultural Competency and Equity Coalition, a national cohort of ballet companies working to become fully anti-racist, multicultural institutions.

### **NEW MEASURES IN 2022—2023 INCLUDED:**


- Dance for All, PNB School's inclusive creative dance pilot class for students ages 6-9, took place March 11—May 6, 2023 at The Francia Russell Center. Dance for All welcomes all abilities, mobilities, and learning needs. This pilot class incorporated knowledge gained from other ballet and dance schools that have adaptive/inclusive programming and from trainings focused on adaptive/inclusive teaching, while building on PNB's ongoing sensory-friendly programming and the work its Community Education department has done in special education classrooms in schools. PNB School partnered with the University of Washington's Occupational Therapy department, aided by three occupational therapy student volunteers with experience in dance and disability. PNB also engaged consultant Tiffany Sparks-Keeney, a professor of occupational therapy at the University of Puget Sound, who works with arts organizations to make their programming more inclusive. Class content mirrored PNB School's creative movement classes, with an expanded age range and more in-class support.
- Based on educator and family feedback, DISCOVER DANCE revised its performance day model in 2022/2023, holding the dress rehearsal and performance on the same day. Students spent the entire day at McCaw Hall, rehearsing, touring the building, attending a career panel with PNB employees, and enjoying a pizza dinner sponsored by PNB partner Pagliacci Pizza before the performance. 2,037 family members attended the two DISCOVER DANCE performances (November 2022 and March 2023) at no cost, for a ticket subsidy of nearly \$25,000.

# **COMMUNITY EDUCATION PROGRAMS**

PNB's Community Education provides high-quality, standards-based dance education to Puget Sound residents through residencies and workshops in public schools, preschools, senior living facilities, virtual spaces, PNB studios, McCaw Hall, and more. Community Education programs include DISCOVER DANCE, student matinees, fieldtrips, Dance To Learn, REACH Student Dance Group, and more; our programs strive to celebrate, affirm, and amplify the creativity and possibilities in every participant.

2022-2023 residency materials were provided in twenty languages (Amharic, Arabic, Chin, Chinese, Creole, Dari, English, Farsi, French, Japanese, Mandinka, Oromo, Pashto, Punjabi, Somali, Spanish, Tagalog, Tigrinya, Ukrainian, and Vietnamese). 2022-2023 also marked PNB's second sensory-friendly season, including two sensory-friendly performances, and the expansion of Community Education programming to the local senior community.

Through PNB's partnership with TAT Lab, Community Education staff trained 27 arts educators in a seven-month professional development program centered on instructional design and social justice in arts education, and an additional 65 arts educators and TAT Lab alumni through three community workshops.

### 2022-2023 PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

Thanks to an anonymous gift, **692** Seattle Public School students and teachers from **30** partner classrooms were able to attend *George Balanchine's The Nutcracker®* for free. Included in this partnership were free preperformance workshops, study guides provided in five languages, and transportation to and from McCaw Hall.

514 students from 12 schools and organizations visited PNB studios for a behind-the-scenes experience in the professional world of ballet. Students took a dance class, toured the PNB costume shop, saw and felt costumes and ballet shoes up close, and observed professional dancers at work.

# **AUDIENCE EDUCATION**

PNB's audience education programming engages thousands of community members each season, bringing new perspectives and deeper knowledge to enrich the ballet-going experience. 2022-2023 saw the full return of all PNB audience education initiatives, both in person at McCaw Hall and online. In November 2022 we celebrated World Ballet Day with a livestreamed joint company class with Dance Theatre of Harlem, taught by Juan Carlos Penuela of DTH and Kiyon Ross of PNB; in April 2023 we heard from former PNB dancers and alumni of Second Stage (PNB's career transition program for dancers). The PNB blog featured 50th anniversary interviews with PNB company dancers, glimpses into the different decades of PNB's 50 years, and opportunities to learn

Ballet Talk, led by Doug Fullington, provides an informal 30-min introduction to each performance with 2,604 attendees last season. Ballet Talk has also been shared in podcast form since the 2018-2019 season, with nearly 25,000 listeners to-date. PNB released five episodes of Ballet Talk during the 2022-2023 season with over 2,400 downloads.

### **MEET THE ARTIST**

3,408 Meet the Artist, hosted by Artistic Director Peter Boal and free to all ticketholders, is PNB's series of post-performance interviews with choreographers and dancers. In 2022-2023, Meet The Artist engaged over 3,400 attendees.

### **CONVERSATIONS & DRESS REHEARSAL**


In 2022-2023 PNB brought back its popular Conversations/Dress Rehearsal series. 960 attendees enjoyed an in-depth discussion with PNB artists and experts, including Crystal Pite and before attending an exclusive dress rehearsal performance with PNB Company dancers and the PNB Orchestra.

### DIGITAL DANCE FILM FESTIVAL


PNB held its second dance film festival, with six dance films selected by a diverse panel of industry professionals, in April 2023, attracting 200 ticket buyers. The festival was also shared at a free public screening in August 2023 at Seattle Center's Mural Amphitheater.

### PNB IS LISTENING

PNB is Listening is an ongoing collaboration between PNB artists and staff, designed to highlight diverse voices within our community, with over 1,100 viewers in 2022-2023. Beginning in January 2023, the series moved toward a podcast format. Its first recording, a panel discussion from PNB's Community Open House in observance of International Holocaust Remembrance Day, drew 313 listeners.

Pacific Northwest Ballet Artistic Director Peter Boal's radiant, historically informed production of Giselle drew international accolades when it premiered in 2011. PNB's production marked the first time an American ballet company had based a production on Stepanov notation as well as the first use in modern times of the rare French sources for *Giselle*. PNB brought *Giselle* back in 2014, newly adorned in luxurious 19th century costumes and scenery, conceived and designed by Jérôme Kaplan (*Don Quixote, Roméo et Juliette*). Originally scheduled for spring 2020, *Giselle* finally returned to the stage in February 2023.

Last year the Foundation received \$1,746,000 new gifts and bequests, and gifted \$1,005,000 to support PNB. This amount is 4.5% of the average investment portfolio balance over the last three years. Our investment return was 13.2% for 2023. Compared to peer investment portfolios under \$50 million, PNB's 2023 return was in the top 5<sup>th</sup> percentile. Over the last 10 years, investment return has been 6.8% compared to our policy benchmark return of 6.1%.

Since its formation in 1996, the Foundation has provided over \$16.8 million to support PNB's artistic and educational programs.

The endowment funds are strategically invested to increase the value of the portfolio and to provide a dependable, growing source of annual operating support. The Foundation investments are valued at \$25,345,000 and are diversified among investment categories: 81% in Equities, 8% in Real Assets such as natural resources and real estate, and 11% in Fixed Income .

The PNB Foundation Board meets quarterly to monitor the investments, review the performance of investment managers, and determine whether to make changes to the allocation of funds or the managers.






